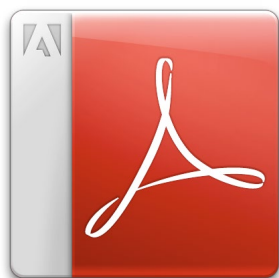

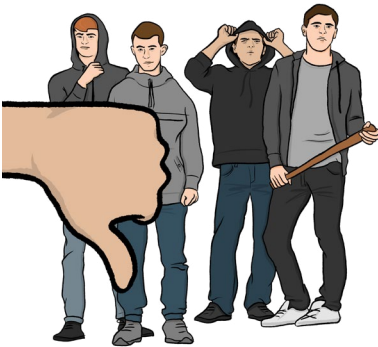


Serious violence

Serious violence is when somebody is hurt so badly that they have to go to hospital.



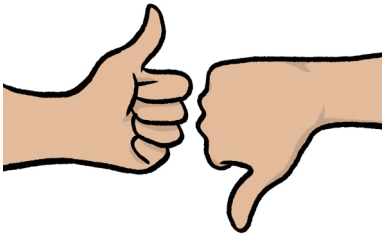
Serious violence has been going up in the UK recently.

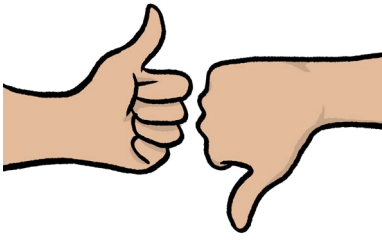

I don't know how much money we will get from the Government next year.

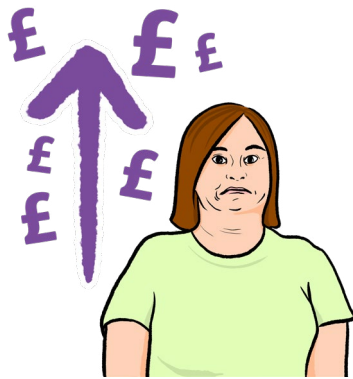


The Government has said that there will be 20,000 new police officers in England and Wales next year.

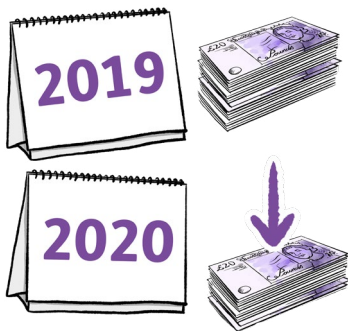


Although the Government will pay for the new police officers, I think that:

- The Government won't give us any more money than last year



- Other costs will go up, because prices and wages are going up



- We will have less money to spend next year than last year



We could get more money to spend if there was an increase to Council Tax.



Question 7: If there was an increase to Council Tax, which of these options would you prefer?

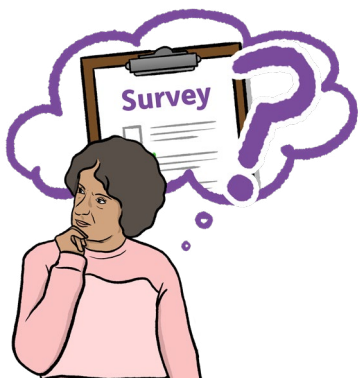

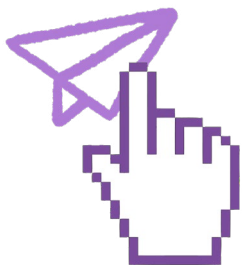

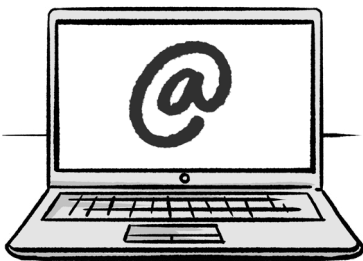
